


Strict rules protected:

Pros	Cons
Better protection	Less choice
Lower dispute probability	No registrars
Faster dispute resolution (by NIC.LV)	Higher prices
Lower cybersquatting rate	Longer registration procedure



Liberal rules

Pros	Cons
Faster registration process	Higher dispute probability
Freedom of choice	Can register (almost) anything
Can introduce registry- registrar system	Longer dispute resolution procedure
Lower prices	Higher cybersquatting probability








Interesting facts

- People from higher income group do not support liberalisation




Main reasons why people do not support liberalisation

Do you support liberalisation?








What ISPs expect?

- ensure correlation between domain names and content






Government:

- wants to protect itself






